# **VOLUNTEERING EVENTS**

Volunteering Opportunities for Science Fairs:

Contra Costa County Science & Engineering Fair - March 8.

HELP! Contra Costa County Science & Engineering Fair—IN-PERSON in 2024—is scheduled for Friday, March 8 from 8 a.m. to 3 p.m. at Los Medanos College in Pittsburg and we need your help!

Without **your** involvement, further competitions would not be available to our student competitors in the county. Students need to go through their County Science Fair to be able to compete at the California Science Fair, the National Middle School Science Fair, and the International Science Fair.

In existence since 2005, the Contra Costa Science Fair expects to have about 200 student competitors who will need your expertise to evaluate project boards and conduct interviews.

The fair will require each judge volunteer to give a full 8 hours of time to ensure every student(s) project has access to multiple interviews. Won't you volunteer to be a judge on March 8?

Judges choose among the six competition categories:

- behavioral/social sciences including gerontology;
- biological including biochemistry, microbiology, zoology, botany, medicine, and health;
- engineering;
- environmental sciences;
- math/computer sciences; and
- physical science including chemistry, earth and space, physics.

There are two student competition levels: JUNIOR: Grades 7 and 8; and SENIOR: Grades 9 through 12. You may choose the competition level most suited to your preferences.

Several Chevron employees and retirees volunteer for this regularly and we always need more judges. Brad McCullough has volunteered since before he retired and says it is a lot of fun and an incredible learning experience - these students are incredible!

## SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM 2024-2025

# **DEADLINE MAY 15, 2024**

This scholarship program is for children, grandchildren, or great grandchildren of paid CRA Contra Costa Chapter members. The selection criteria is based on academics, achievements, personal insights, and future goals. We have a team of judges made up of two Chapter board members, a CRA national representative, an HR retiree, and an educator. Based on prior year giving and the donation from the Graduates Committee, we anticipate awarding **six scholarships for \$2000 each** for this academic year. The scholarship application is available on the chapter website.

We suggest that you encourage your children, grandchildren, or great grandchildren to apply for one of the scholarships. Applicants that meet the requirements below should apply by submitting their applications by email (preferred) by **May 15, 2024.** 

Students may apply each year they are eligible, but those who have previously been awarded one of our scholarships are not eligible to reapply. The criteria for eligibility are:

- Be a child, grandchild or great grandchild of a dues paying member of the chapter.
- Be age 25 and under.
- Be enrolled, or plan to be enrolled, in the coming school year in a full-time undergraduate course of study at an accredited two or four-year college or university.

We always appreciate your scholarship donations that you can make through Zelle, PayPal, or by check payable to Chevron Retirees Association, P.O. Box 371, Orinda, CA 94563. Since we started the program in 2005, we have awarded over \$131,000 to scholarship recipients. We are so proud of all our scholarship recipients, and we are pleased that our members have supported our program. The individuals we support may be future Chevron leaders!
